

Children's SSA



Service and Support Administrators (SSA) work with youth ages 3 through graduation, who are Board eligible, to navigate the DD system and engage in support services. The SSA can support the journey through childhood with the goal of full community membership. The SSA is a trouble-shooter, a problem-solver and a resource for the child.



How do we do this?

- Developing a Person Centered Plan – This detailed plan allows us to get to know your child's strengths and needs and serves as a guide for your child's journey
- Facilitating Team meetings and home/community visits to coordinate services and supports based on the child's needs related to their disability
- Collaborating with other professionals and other agencies to move towards successful transitions in school and from school to adulthood, including preparing for community employment
- Linking with service providers and community resources and assist with navigating systems such as Social Security and Medicaid
- Empowering the child and family to self advocate
- Utilizing Specialized supports for social emotional challenges
- Utilizing community supports to help foster growth and development

Service and Support services are individualized based on the needs of your child and will always remain voluntary. You have the right to access or discontinue services at any time.
